Summer Intern Program applications now available

The Arthur R. Marshall Foundation and Florida Environmental Institute, Inc. is now accepting applications for its paid, career-enhancing summer internship for college undergraduates and graduate students with top grades in their areas of study. Students pursuing a variety of degrees are encouraged to apply, including those studying environmental science, education, engineering, economics, and law.

This intensive, 12-week program focuses on the Florida Everglades and the multi-billion dollar plan to restore it. Participants will gain an increased probability of preference for future jobs, as they join the 43 past Marshall summer intern graduates since 2002 that are currently making significant contributions in their career fields.

Canoe Expedition begins on January 18 at the Refuge
