Using Sources in APA

1. Best Possible Evidence:
 - a. Support your claims.
 - b. Use balanced and credible sources.
2. Integrating Sources:
 - a. Use your sources to back up your ideas, not to be the ideas themselves.
 - b. Introduce quotes rather than simply dropping them in.
3. Citation:
 - a. **DO NOT PLAGIARIZE:** If you borrow it, cite it.
 - b. Basic in-text citation:
 - i. (Author, Year)
 - ii. Leave out whatever is mentioned in your actual paragraph.
 - c. Basic Reference Page
 - i. Last name, First initial. (Date). Title. Where it came from.
 - ii. For a journal article, add the name of the journal, the issue, and the page numbers.
 - iii. For a book, add information on the publisher.
 - iv. For a website, add the date you found it and the web address.
