

shots, the Scuba Club has what you need, including a HD camera with a *waterproof casing. The facility has a pro shop where they sell and rent scuba gear, a swimming pool and a deep tank. The tank is 20x20x16ft. deep, and the pool is 45x20x8ft. deep. The average temperature for the tank is around 75. degrees and the pool is around 80 degrees. Looking to find Nemo in the depths. of the ocean? The Scuba Club's divemasters can escort you on dives to lush reefs or decaying wrecks. They have a U.S. Coast Guard certified


